COVID-19 Health and Safety Reminder

DDSB@Home Secondary and the DDSB are committed to ensuring that learning and working environments are safe for staff and students. The school has implemented a variety of health and safety measures, requiring all secondary students to wear a mask, encouraging frequent handwashing, requiring students and staff to stay home if sick, employing physical distancing strategies, and undertaking enhanced cleaning and disinfection of frequently touched surfaces to name a few. You can always review the <u>Secondary Daily</u> <u>Checklist</u> for students as a reminder on what to do every day before coming to school.

The DDSB is encouraging families to continue to follow the advice of public health officials, including taking appropriate precautions in their day to day lives such as: wearing a mask in indoor public spaces, frequent handwashing, staying at home if sick and avoiding social gatherings. **Remember - limiting your close contacts to those in your household (i.e., the people you live with) will help to limit the spread of COVID-19.**
